Why publish?

MyfriendandEditor-in-Chiefof*TheTrinityReview*, Audrey Lai, has a real<u>ly good answer</u> to this question:

"[Writing is] always a conversation. [...] Nothing is original. You're always in conversation with things that you've read before, other people that you're inspired by, things that you consume in your day-to-day life. [...] Getting published is kind of like joining in that conversation."

For me (Nghi), I really enjoy getting to share my art. I love consuming my peers' art. I love going to journal launches and getting to listen to my friends' poetry being spoken aloud. I love the materiality of publishing, how I get to hold art in my hand.

Engaging with any part of the literary community on campus, whether that means publishing, reading, or joining a masthead, means entering a world of people that love writing and take it seriously.

Of course, there are career benefits too. Getting published on campus helps you get a glimpse into what professional publishing looks like. Getting your academic work published is quite significant if you are interested in research.

How it looks like

Gettingpublished on campusgenerallyfollowsthesameprocess:

- 1. **Submission** (or Pitch, when working with a new spaper)
- 2. Editing
- 3. Launch!

Newspapers publish biweekly to monthly, while academic journals and lit mags publish biannually to annually. Please visit each publication's site to make yourself aware of specific submission deadlines.

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Lit mags publish the widest variety of works, usually including process poetry, comics, illustrations, and photography.
